## UPCOMING PROJECT INFORMATION TRUMBULL COUNTY ENGINEER PLANS RESURFACING ON PAINESVILLE WARREN STATE ROAD IN SOUTHLINGTON & FARMINGTON TOWNSHIPS

Trumbull County Engineer, Randy Smith, proposes to improve Painesville Warren State Road (C.H. 206) in Southington and Farmington Townships, Trumbull County, Ohio. The project proposes to mill and resurface 3.855 miles of Painesville Warren State Road from State Route 534 to the Trumbull County line. Additional work includes the replacement of four (4) culverts, partial-depth pavement repairs, the installation of new guardrail and anchor assemblies, and the application of edge/center/stop lines and other pavement markings throughout the newly paved section of Painesville Warren State Road. This \$1,200,000 project is scheduled to begin construction in the summer/fall of 2021.

During construction, traffic will be maintained at all times, except when it will be necessary to close certain sections of Painesville Warren State Road during the replacement of the various cross culverts. During the replacement of four (4) culverts between Geauga Portage Easterly Road and State Route 88, traffic will be detoured for a maximum of thirty (30) consecutive days. The official detour for this closure will utilize State Route 534 and State Route 88. Construction, lane restrictions, road closure and detour information will be posted along Painesville Warren State Road and on the Trumbull County Engineer webpage, <http://engineer.co.trumbull.oh.us>, prior to the start of construction activities. Access shall be maintained to all adjacent properties and intersecting side streets within the construction limits for the duration of the project.

To ensure the decision-making process is comprehensive, Trumbull County Engineer, Randy Smith, is seeking comments from the public about the social, environmental and economic impacts of this proposed project. Environmental impacts include those involving archeological, architectural and ecological resources, regulated materials and the general location of the project. Trumbull County Engineer also requests information regarding the presence of any known cultural resources in the vicinity of the project including prehistoric and historic archaeological sites, historic bridges, historic buildings, landmarks and districts.
